In their research and courses, faculty engage with pressing questions of policy and practice. To this end, program faculty enact innovative teaching practices and lead research projects that are attuned to our current technological and sociopolitical climate. Our interdisciplinary approach and research opportunities encourage students in the program to work in partnership with schools and communities to organize innovative practices that open up opportunities for transformative learning.

The LSHD program is on the leading edge of the field in its theoretical and practical explorations of social and spatial justice, community-engaged research methods, educational design, and culture and diversity in learning. LSHD faculty and students are leaders in theorizing and building partnerships with schools, districts and state agencies, as well as youth and community organizations.
